

Primary 1 Home Learning Literacy Activities

<p>Check P1/2/3 Homework on Google classroom for this week's spelling words. Try some of these activities to help you learn your words.</p> <p>Rainbow writing...write each word out 3 times. Write your word firstly in ordinary pencil and then write it two more times using coloured pencils. You could choose a colour for the whole word or write each letter in a different colour.</p> <p>Spelling flowers...draw a picture of a garden with a flower for each of your spelling words. Write your word inside the flower. You will need to make the flower big enough for your word. Colour your picture.</p> <p>Newspaper spelling...make your spelling words using letters cut from a magazine or newspaper.</p>	<p>Check P1/2/3 Home Learning on Google classroom for this week's sounds. Try some of the following activities to help you learn your sounds.</p> <p>Look through your reading book or a favourite picture book and try to find words containing your sounds.</p> <p>Ask an adult to help you name 4 objects with your sound in them (could be at the beginning/middle or end). Divide a piece of paper into 4 sections by folding it or drawing lines with a ruler and write the objects name, the draw and colour a picture to illustrate.</p> <p>Download the free Jolly Phonics app and find your sound. Listen and work on forming it correctly.</p> <p>Ask an adult to help you write a list of words containing your sound (3 or 4 words will do) and then chalk your words outside in the garden.</p>	<p>Look at the colour band on the reader you have from school...is it pink/red/yellow or blue? Log in to Oxford Owls online. The username is quarterp1/2 and the password is read. On the e books homepage select level, scroll down to book band and choose the colour you are working on in class.</p> <p>Pick a book and read it with an adult. There are also activities for some of the books. You will need your pencils and some paper. Decide what you want to write about. It could be some news or just something interesting like what your hobby is. Draw a picture of what you will be writing about. Add lots of detail. Where are you? Who is there? What are you wearing? How are you feeling? Next ask an adult to write down what you want to say in the style of writing you use, using your words on a post it for you to copy under your picture. Colour your picture and remember to start your sentence with a capital letter and finish with a full stop.</p>	<p>Check which phonemes you have been working on over the last 2 or 3 weeks on Google classroom. Go to ICT games using the link below and choose these sounds to work with on one or two of the games.
